**BREWERS CHARITIES AND THE MILLER PARK STADIUM  
DISTRICT COMMUNITY PROGRAM PROVIDE GRANT FOR  
'SUMMER OF BASEBALL' PROGRAM**

**MILWAUKEE** – The Milwaukee Brewers are about a third of the way through the 2008 season of baseball. Meanwhile, five teams of students from three urban schools are preparing for a 'Summer of Baseball', thanks in part to a grant from Brewers Charities, Inc. and the Miller Park Stadium District Community Program, Inc.

On June 10, 2008, Brewers Charities and the Miller Park Stadium District Community Program will each present PAVE with \$5,000 to help fund its 'Summer of Baseball' program.

The 'Summer of Baseball' program is part of PAVE's summer program for low-income urban students aimed at addressing educational proficiency and skill loss during the summer break and to help alleviate the achievement gap between low-income and high-income students.

Up to 100 students in grades 6 – 8 from three urban schools will participate in the 'Summer of Baseball'. The program will culminate in a day-long tournament at Helfaer Field, the little league field at Miller Park, on August 5th, 2008.

"The Community Program is proud to support the 'Summer of Baseball'. This is a wonderful opportunity for students that provides both educational and enrichment opportunities," said Perfecto Rivera of the Miller Park Stadium District Community Program. The Community Program is a non-profit charitable organization funded by businesses that built Miller Park and by friends of Miller Park.
